# WITHDRAWAL OF ACB-OSH – STANDARDS MALAYSIA REQUIREMENTS FOR BODIES OPERATING ASSESSMENT AND CERTIFICATION OF OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS

#### 1. Introduction

On 25 January 2018, the International Accreditation Forum (IAF) has published IAF MD 22:2018 – Application of ISO/IEC 17021-1 for the Certification of Occupational Health and Safety Management Systems (OH&SMS). Subsequently in March 2018, the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) has published ISO/IEC TS 17021-10 – Conformity Assessment – Requirements for Bodies Providing Audit and Certification of Management Systems – Part 10: Competence Requirements for Auditing and Certification of Occupational Health and Safety Management Systems.

Subsequently, the ACB-OSH shall be withdrawn and IAF MD 22:2018 and ISO/IEC TS 17021-10 shall be directly used as additional requirements to the ISO/IEC 17021-1.

This circular applies to all Certification Bodies (CBs) accredited to this management systems programme.

## 2. Objective

This circular is aimed to inform all accredited management system CBs on the transition arrangements to be carried out by certification bodies.

## 3. Requirements

#### 3.1 Transition arrangements

As the new published IAF MD 22:2018 and ISO/IEC TS 17021-10 were developed for bodies providing audit and certification of occupational health and safety management systems based on ISO 45001:2018. Therefore, Standards Malaysia will follow the transition period as per ACB Circular 2:2018.

#### 3.1 Accredited Certification Bodies

 Certification bodies (CB) are advised to transition to the new requirements, IAF MD 22 and ISO/IEC TS 17021-10 together with

- the transition of OHSAS 18001:2007 and/or MS 1722:2011 to ISO 45001:2018 (Refer ACB Circular 2/2018).
- ii. Standards Malaysia shall assess all related accredited certification bodies against the new standard as part of the annual office assessments beginning <u>12 March 2019</u>. A verification assessment may be carried out to verify compliance against the new standard.
- iii. Findings to the new IAF MD 22:2018 and ISO/IEC 17021-10:2018 shall be raised as non-conformance or observations depending on the nature of the subject matter. Corrective actions for the non-conformances shall be verified and closed out before recommendation for accreditation to OSH based on ISO/IEC 17021-1:2015, ISO/IEC TS 17021-10:2018 and IAF MD 22: 2018 can be granted.
- iv. If a certification body fails to comply with IAF MD 22:2018 and ISO/IEC TS 17021-10:2018 by 12 March 2021, the certification body shall be <u>suspended</u> for a maximum of 3 months. After the suspension, failure of the certification bodies to take any action would result in <u>withdrawal</u> of accreditation.

# 3.2 New Application:

- i. All new applications received after the date of publication of this circular shall be assessed against ISO/IEC 17021-1:2015, ISO/IEC TS 17021-10:2018 and IAF MD 22: 2018.
- ii. For existing applicants, assessments after <u>1 March 2019</u> shall be assessed against ISO/IEC TS 17021-10:2018 and IAF MD 22: 2018.

## 3.3 Extension of Scope:

i. No extension of scope to ACB-OSH shall be accepted after <u>the</u> <u>date of publication of this circular</u>.

# 4. Validity of ACB-OSH

The status of accreditation to ACB-OSH will remain valid until the certification body achieves the transition or until the end of the transition period, i.e <u>12 March</u> 2021.
